Year 3, 4, 5 children have not been accounted for in the data as they do not have external assessments to report on

Number of Pupil Premium children can increase throughout the course of the year therefore figures may not correlate

- At Year 2 100% of children achieved good or better progress since the beginning of year 1 in writing, and 3 out of 4 children did so in reading and maths.
- At KS2 100% achieved the required standard of level 4+ for reading and maths, and 2 out of 3 pupils did for writing.
- 1 Year 6 child achieved level 5 in reading.
- All children achieved 2 or more levels of progress in KS2 SATS in reading, and 2 out of 3 did in writing and maths.
