



Pupil Premium Mid-Year Report - March 2016

Spending of Pupil Premium focuses on curricular adaptations and interventions with targeted support to enhance children’s learning. This is largely done through teacher and TA interventions but also takes the form of support through developing family links and support.

Since January 2014, the spending of the Pupil Premium Grant has focussed on targeted academic support for pupil premium children. This support has taken the form of bespoke interventions in small group work, 1:1 support with teachers and teaching assistants and support for families through SENCo support.

This academic year, our new assessment tracking information indicates that PPF children are performing slightly better overall. We continue to track children carefully and adjust support throughout the year according to their needs.

We have also focussed on attendance for this group of children in school. Targeted attendance support has meant an increase in attendance for PPF children (see chart).
